## Info ON THE PID

The Prestonwood Public Improvement District (PID) is a City of Dallas-regulated district assigned to provide additional safety in the form of 24 hour police services exclusive to our neighborhood. It is funded by a mandatory assessment on property values within Prestonwood.

Plans are underway to obtain approval for the renewal of the PID with our drive beginning this fall. It will require an intense effort to achieve the needed results of approximately 70% approval of the total homes in the PID by both number and property appraised value. We will need many volunteers to help make this a successful drive.



The PID continues to be efficient and effective with high neighborhood coverage and a low crime rate. Please remember to call the PID (972-333-3441) before you go out of town so that they can give your home a little more careful coverage.

## Gardening Tips Courtesy of Prestonwood Homeowners Association

This past winter was extremely hard on our yards and landscaping.

It has been only recently that we have seen new growth. Now is the time to pamper your lawn, perform shrub pruning, fertilize everything, begin composting, be kind to birds, and finish with a nice layer of mulch.

Check things off the list, and your landscape will be the envy of the neighborhood.





#### SURVEY YOUR YARD

Make note of tree limbs that should be removed or cabled, especially those that overhang structures. Hire an arborist to maintain large trees. Cut down last year's perennial foliage. Check fences, steps, and pathways for disrepair caused by freezing and thawing.

#### **TUNE UP YOUR TOOLS**

Give your lawn tools some TLC so they're in good shape when it's time to work.

#### FILL IN YOUR BEDS

Choose new plants for any parts of the garden that feel bare. Order trees and shrubs for spring planting.

#### REFRESH YOUR LAWN

If you've got grass, spring is an important time to turn your attention to your turf. Clear the lawn of winter debris and look for areas that need attention before mowing.

#### PRUNE YOUR SHRUBS

Remove dead, damaged branches from woody plants. Thin and trim blooming shrubs such as hydrangea, and most roses. Prune cold-damaged summer blooming plants after plants resume spring growth. Prune spring-blooming shrubs and trees after flowering.

#### 🏂 PLANT YOUR CONTAINER-GROWN PLANTS

You probably have container plants from last year. Now is the time to transplant them. You can do this anytime during the growing season except during the heat of midsummer. Be sure to water them thoroughly before and after they go in the ground.

#### 📤 FERTILIZE YOUR EVERYTHING

Apply fertilizer around trees and shrubs when new growth appears. Spread high-acid fertilizer and pine-needle mulch around acid-loving shrubs like azaleas, camellias, or citrus. Begin fertilizing perennials when active growth resumes.

#### 🕏 CLEAN YOUR BIRD FEEDERS AND BIRD BATHS

Now is a great time to give bird feeders a refresh. Disinfect by scrubbing with weak bleach solution (1/4 cup bleach: 2 gallons warm water). Rinse and dry the feeders before refilling them. Scrub birdbaths with bleach solution, then rinse them thoroughly and refill, changing water weekly.

#### MULCH YOUR BEDS

A thick layer of mulch gives everything a clean look while thwarting weeds and retaining moisture.

Volunteers In Patrol (VIP) is PHA's neighborhood patrol program formed to help reduce crime through cooperation with DPD off duty Police Officers. VIP patrollers are trained monthly by DPD officers to patrol our streets and alleys on a weekly basis to ensure our neighborhood is secure and safe.

- Remember to close your garage doors
- Close and lock your gates
- If you are planning to travel, let the PID Officer know so they can keep an eye on your home
- Keep your speed to 30 mph on our streets and less than 15 mph in your alley. Watch for children playing and those who run, walk, and bike along our streets.
- Don't feed wild animals and report wild animal sittings on our facebook page to make other residents aware. We've seen several bobcats in the area.
- Wear reflective gear (you and your dog!) when walking at night
- Outwit porch pirates by doing one or more of the following:
  - o Install security cameras or add a smart doorbell
  - o Use an Amazon locker or an Amazon Key
  - o Pick up packages in person
  - o Have packages delivered to your office
  - o Request signature confirmation or a knock to know a package has been delivered
  - o Create a delivery corner to hide packages behind or utilize package delivery lock boxes
  - o Upgrade your mailbox, making it larger to handle small to medium sized packages
  - o Get to know your neighbors reaching out to your neighbors builds trust and makes teaming up on safety and crime prevention easier; maybe your neighbor may be willing to accept deliveries for you!
